Night of 1000 Stars – Saturday, December 14th

GRANT COUNTY, WA – ‘Night of 1000 Stars’ is an annual statewide effort dedicated to finding and removing impaired drivers from the road. On Saturday, December 14th from 5:00 pm to 2:00 am, local law enforcement will conduct DUI emphasis patrols throughout Grant County. Each star symbolizes the badge worn by a law enforcement officer.

In 2023, 24 people died on Grant County's roads and state-managed highways. Those deaths were due to either an impaired driver, a speeding driver, or a distracted driver. In some cases, a driver had more than one of those behaviors.

Anytime you plan to consume alcohol, make plans ahead of time to ensure you have a safe and sober ride home. Drunk driving has the devastating potential to take a life in an instant.

Ensure the safety of yourself and others:

- If it's your turn to be the designated driver, take your job seriously and don't drink.
- Don't let someone get behind the wheel if they have been using alcohol, cannabis, or other drugs.
- Always wear your seatbelt. It is your best defense against impaired drivers.
- Provide a safe environment for youth to thrive substance free.
- If you see an impaired driver, call 911.

Getting home safe is always worth it.
